ADMINISTRATION REPORTS

CHAIRMAN/PRESIDENT

I seem to say it every year, but this year is no different. Yet another challenging time was ahead in regards to the season just passed. This however, will be indeed my last time saying this as this is my last report as I will no longer be standing for president or chairman of the club as of the current AGM this August.

2022/23 created more opportunity for players and for people on and off the field than it has in the past. We had many challenges, one of which has been for the past few years and that is, numbers: recruitment and retention. Cricket is proving to be one of those sports along with others where numbers playing the game seem to be dwindling at club level as does the support financially; also behind the scenes to find volunteers as well as support from governing bodies.

St Albans has always been blessed with the fact that people come from teams onto the committee committed to make a difference and help govern the sport with the challenges given from above and generated from playing days. This season was no different and the work that was done in the off-season was monumental than us having teams with full numbers to play the game on most Saturdays.

There were two groups set up over the winter, both in the men's and the women's game to help recruit overseas players but also to work hard in our own city to bring players back who had previously played for the club, as well as those that were continuing to play at the club. We were very lucky through this hard work on the both the men's and women's side to have a number of people come from the UK. While this proved fruitful in the men's side of the draw, unfortunately it did not prove so much on the women's. For the first time in many years it was unfortunate that we had to pull the Premier women's side out of the competition. I can assure you all that this was not done lightly and was done with input from many people in regards to how we could solve the problem of not having enough players through many reasons, injuries, retirements, etc.

I went to a meeting with Christchurch Metro Cricket in October to advise them of this and also for us to plan ahead for the future. Part of this I'm pleased to say has already happened with our Under-16 team after Christmas being promoted into the Under-19 competition. From here we now need to recruit again and the players that were loaned out to other clubs will come back under the St Albans banner. We will have the chance again to go out and find players to represent the club at the Premier level. There is a group of committee members who are concentrating on this and I am pleased to say that some progress has been made. The next step for the club is to present this at a Christchurch Metro Cricket board meeting, whereby it will be assessed whether or not there is an opportunity for us to rejoin the grade.

I would like to take the opportunity to thank all those previously and currently involved in trying to resurrect our Premier women's side. As we have known before our club is strong when we are represented well on the women's side of the club. It was very pleasing to see that so many of the young players turned up to our awards evening on the final night of the season. I believe that the club sits in a strong position at present at the lower grades in developing players within the women's game, however a lot of attention still needs to be paid to the top end. However, there are of course other challenges that may hinder this process. New Zealand Cricket has decided to have an 'A' competition for the women this year, which again will take a rotation of another 16 to 18 players away from Premier cricket as well as the current Magicians side. Any plans to have a women's Premier team will have to take into account the ever-changing program at domestic level. I'm sure that Metro will be discussing this as well and maybe defining what the Premier women's competition will now be in the future.

Although numbers were a challenge at times it was very pleasing to see that St Albans performed well on the field in all grades. While there were highlights and some lowlights at stages there were a lot of performances worthy

of mention. I will not take away the gloss of the captain's reports featured later in this document by mentioning some and not others.

I would however like to mention a couple of people specifically. It is hard to go past the achievements of both Amy Satterthwaite and Aaron Johnstone.

As you will be aware Amy announced her retirement from all cricket during this current season. It is very rare to have a player such as Amy to only have ever played for one club and her achievements are exceptional to say the least. Not only has Amy been a superb player on the field but she has been an excellent ambassador for the game and our club off the field. Amy's career is highlighted further in this report but it was pleasing to see that all of her achievements for the game were honoured in the latest King's Birthday Honours lists whereby she achieved the Order of Merit of New Zealand for her services to cricket.

While it is rare to get one player to play their whole career at one club, there is another retiree who achieved this, namely Aaron Johnstone. Aaron too has a very long and distinguished career with the club, breaking nearly every record held in Christchurch Metro Cricket competitions as a wicket-keeper (though runs mostly still elude him). At our club awards evening at the end of the season Aaron was honoured with the presentation of a framed '361' shirt (the number of Premier games he played at the moment he broke the all-time record). Aaron too has been an exceptional ambassador for St Albans throughout the years and has seen many changes both in playing personnel and also in committees off the field. Aaron is yet to technically hang up his gloves at this stage and still has the opportunity to increase his dismissal tally to make it even more difficult for any future record chasers to overhaul.

A club at its top level is only as good as its feeder sides, in the case of the female section: our juniors. There are many challenges faced running this section - a lot of them financial - in this day and age getting people to play cricket and that is also felt at the junior level. It was pleasing to say that the club was represented well at junior level with its number of teams and participants every Saturday. Matt and Trish Davis worked tirelessly to get players onto the field and to communicate with the parents over the season to ensure that the season went down without a hiccup. I

have been informed that both Matt and Trish will be moving on from their position as junior conveners and I would personally like to thank you both for all the work that you have done over the past three to four years. It is pleasing to say that they will however still be involved at a team level.

Other changes this year came via new coaching staff. Mark Lane became head coach for the men's side of the competition and Blair Franklin and for the women's side. Due to the Premier women's team withdrawal Blair moved his concentration to the men's Championship team, helping to develop individuals be prepared to hit the Premier grade if required. There was some excellent progress made with players coming up and down out of the Premier men's team, with individual improvement and also strategies both on and off the field. I would like to thank both Mark and Blair for the input last season and hope that in some way this continues for the future.

On the women's side, the focus switched to development, with Kirsty Bond taking on the Under-16 side with the focus to have enough positive results by Christmas to put this side into the Under-19 grade as planned. Aply helped by Rob Young, this was achieved. As previously mentioned, the focus for women's cricket is to have a Premier team in the future, and this result has gone a long way towards that. Kirsty has advised that she is no longer available for coaching next season and on behalf of the whole club I would like to personally thank Kirsty for her input and her experience looking after the women's teams over the past few seasons. While this will be a challenge for the section in the future, the excellent work by Kirsty and others will ensure that we have a strong foundation to work from.

One of our "forever challenges", especially on the social side, is the location of our pavilion. While it is a prime location to watch cricket from, we have all had the struggles of trying to find a car park upon coming back to the club to celebrate our wins or commiserate our losses and tell a few stories about how we scored our runs and those magnificent catches taken, all the good things about cricket that should be discussed over a beverage. For those who made the trip back to the pavilion, your support over the bar and also for the building of the club culture was truly appreciated.

I believe, along with the challenges on the field, we also have a challenge off the field, not only by having to find a

new ground to call our own, but more importantly getting back to a semblance of the great culture and camaraderie off the field that we were renowned for. I know that this has been discussed at some length at committee meetings and I know that in the future this will be a priority for the new management team coming in after the AGM. It was very pleasing however to see the awards evening on the final night of the season held at the club rooms and the generous number of people that attended. I believe that this may be the way of the future that we hold this event or cricket is still fresh in the mind.

Recently, at the Christchurch Metro Cricket chairman's meeting, the future was discussed at length in regards to finances by all clubs attending. While on paper our financial situation does not look the best, this season was indeed budgeted for. While we remember that we have spent significantly through a gaming machine trust money for clothing and equipment we were unlucky this season not to have received monies than we had previously. It was noticeable at this meeting that most successfully granted applications were applied to on the behalf of clubs by people and companies who specialize in working with the gaming machine trusts themselves. With this in mind and many other challenges to be addressed it has been decided that we will engage one of these top people to work with us and the gaming machine trust charities for the coming seasons.

While we are not totally reliant on gaming machine trusts money we also have the support of some excellent sponsors within our St Albans family. Namely the Oxford Group and Bealey Quarter. A special thanks to Max and Sam and their team for their support this season, not only financially but also as our supplier of alcohol through their Super Liquor store in Halswell. We also had contributions from NV Play, Waitoa Brewery, WTC (Fozzies), Maharaja Indian Restaurant and our partners at Kookaburra.

As cricket becomes more expensive to play this will become more and more of a challenge. I am pleased to say however this has been well recognised at all levels not only club, and it is pleasing to say that all clubs are open to a discussion on how we can combat this to ensure that we can provide strong competitions for all players as well as social competitions for those who just enjoy the sport.

There were many individuals within the club that achieved

representative honours this year as well. We had New Zealand representatives in the women's game with Lea Tahuhi (and congratulations to Lea in attaining a NZC contract for the next 12 months), at men's age group level with Josh Olliver making the NZ Under-19 side and at Over-50s level with Craig Gibb and Scott Mason the NZ A side and Pierre Flavell the NZ B side to Australia.

At domestic level we had Amy Satterthwaite, Lea Tahuhi, Natalie Cox and Gabby Sullivan all make the Canterbury Magicians team. On the men's side Lachie Harper and Ben Russell in the Canterbury A side. Congratulations to all those players and I'm sure that St Albans will have more representative players in the near future.

On the committee side we are in for what I can only describe as one of the major shake-ups in the club's history. I will be stepping down as president and chairman and Scott Mason will be stepping down after 22 years service, the last 15 as the club's secretary. In what has been an amazing achievement I would personally like to thank Scott for the efforts that he has put in over the years and also the help he has provided me over the last seven years. We will also be losing Kris Pagan and George Devine. Both have provided excellent sounding boards and input into the men's afternoon grades.

While we say goodbye to some, we welcome others. Particularly the appointment of Greg Olliver to the role of chairman. Greg played 106 Premier games during the 15-year period he was previously with the club from the mid-1980s to late 1990s, now making a return of sorts to Christchurch after a long period in Auckland.

I want to wish Greg well for the future as I am sure he will bring a fresh approach and new way of thinking to take the club in the right direction and I have full confidence in his approach as he will make every post a winning one.

With that I would like to thank all those that have given me your opinions, options, advice and support over the past seven years and look forward to relaxing with you all after a day's play reminiscing about what happened and could have been as wish you all the very best for the winter and the season ahead.

TEAM REPORTS

PREMIER MEN

The new season would see as many as ten new debutants welcomed to the team and a new head coach in Mark Lane. The side set out to continue building on the success of the previous years.

During the season, club stalwart Aaron Johnstone would notch up a new milestone surpassing 400 Premier matches. An incredible achievement over a long period of time which never saw his competitive edge lessen and sheer resilience from his body – in particular his fingers!

Twenty20 Competition

A change to the format of this competition saw the removal of semi-finals, meaning the opening fixtures were critical to compete for a finals spot.

The opening game against a strong T20 side in Sydenham would be an early benchmark. Bowling first Saints would restrict the visitors to 154 from their allotment with wickets shared. A strong top order partnership between Nicholas Hendrie (31) and James O’Gorman (45) had the chase well placed before momentum was lost with Saints falling 20 short of their target.

A second loss to East Shirley put the team under pressure and were staring down the barrel of a third loss against Heathcote until a superb innings of 78* from Matthias Paltridge including last over heroics put Saints on the board. A loss to OBC would see the chances to earn a place in the final extinguished.

The team would finish the competition with some strong performances, including defending 97 against LPW led by excellent figures of 3/7 by Ian Souness, 2/5 by Lachie Harper and 3/18 from Joe Lowe.

The bowlers would do the damage again against a strong Burnside team dismissing them for just 81. Souness 2/11,

Angus Olliver 3/15 and Matt Holstein 2/11.

Overall Result: 3rd

One-Day Competition

The side has experienced plenty of success in the one-day competition over the years, however the 2022/23 season would be one to forget.

Two matches would be played before the Christmas break with results not going to plan. The restart in the New Year did not bring a change of fortunes and would see the side finish at the bottom of the table.

All was not lost with Saints entering the last three rounds of the two-day competition at the top of the table.

Overall Result: 8th

Two-Day Competition

The opening game of the season would see Saints match up against a full strength OBC side. Despite positive performances with the bat from Greg Dawson (78) and O’Gorman (57 & 72) the season would start off on the back foot. Thankfully some poor judgement from OBC and rule book clauses would ensure the side did not walk away empty handed.

Saints followed this up with a couple of strong performances collecting outright victories over LPW and Riccarton.

Paltridge (50 & 95) and Langrope (49* & 62*) did the heavy lifting with the bat against LPW before convincing performances with the ball from Angus Olliver 4/55 and Holstein 3/11 would see the win complete.

Despite a first innings fiver from Souness (5/50) Saints found themselves in a fight for first innings points. A hard-fought partnership between O’Gorman (74) and Harper (54) would see the points secured. Joe Lowe (6/29) would intimidate the Riccarton players with both his spin and general presence in the second innings. Dawson (71*) and Paltridge (57*) would then make a statement with the bat completing a ten-wicket victory and vital bonus points.

The early season effort saw the team enter the final three rounds on top of the table. A tough first innings battle against Sydenham was nearly over (with Souness snaring another five wicket haul) before week two would be washed out by rain.

The non-result saw the team place a lot of emphasis on the penultimate match against East Shirley. Batting first a Harper half century saw a total of 158 posted. A steady start from Easts had the game in the balance until Souness (4/39) and Lowe (4/18) joined forces to change the momentum. An exciting run out on the last play of day one would see Saints show up the following weekend with high hopes. An aggressive approach to the second innings would set the tone for the day. Aaron Johnstone (30) showed off his skills opening the batting and would send the East attack to all corners of the ground. He was aptly supported by, Hendrie (43), Paltridge (66*) and O’Gorman (49).

Easts were set a fair target of 250 from 63 overs, however took the option of ‘digging in’. Their openers were disciplined and were immovable for a long period of time. A late flurry of wickets would see them finish 6/182 and the match a draw.

The result meant Saints needed a victory in their final match against Heathcote and results to fall in their favour.

Johnstone would skipper week one, and following the approach from the previous game would see boys batting first and play ‘Az-ball’. A brutal 76 from just 58 balls by Hendrie with several contributions including more valuable runs from Holstein (45) would see a first innings total of 253 posted. Souness would take 7/110 dismissing Heathcote for 215 and crucial first innings points secured.

A week of bad weather had changed the pitch conditions somewhat, and Saints would be bowled out for just 81 in

the second innings. With everything to play for the team got in the fight and set out to defend a modest lead of 120. A couple of early wickets while also limiting scoring maintained pressure on the batting side. A free-flowing 3rd wicket partnership saw the momentum swing until key breakthroughs from Souness (5/52) who would finish with 12 wickets for the match changed the game. The total still in reach of the home side until a fiery spell from Harper (4/18) would clean up the tail and the all-important victory.

A nervous watch of the scores would follow, however the other result would not finish favourably and would see Saints finish a close second. A great victory was an enjoyable way to sign off the season nonetheless.

Overall Result: 2nd

Summary

Club prize giving was held that evening which was a great way for the club to connect with all members before hanging up the boots for another winter.

Ian Souness was named the Premier player of the season taking an impressive 53 wickets!

Joe Lowe was a superb addition to the club and had an impressive season as well taking 43 wickets. Matthias Paltridge would top the batting charts for the side tallying 612 runs for his best season in Premier grade with plenty more to come.

Thanks to all those who played and contributed this season, the efforts and commitment are always appreciated.

CHAMPIONSHIP SABRES MEN

The 22/23 season kicked off with preseason training at the new Sir Richard Hadlee centre in Hagley Park. Anticipation and expectations were high for the upcoming season with a large number of changes to the squad from the previous few seasons. Some notable leavers from previous seasons were: Jack Anderson, Shane Burton, Clem Gibbens, James Southby and Hugh Symes. As you can see that is a considerable number of runs and wickets that we would need to replace. A special mention to Clem Gibbens, who took the season to be spend more time with his young family after over a decade of commitment to this team including two stints as captain. Thanks for all of the time you have given Clem.

As well as the names above we were also not expecting to see many appearances from Matthias Paltridge and Tom Flavell as they stepped up into larger roles within the premier setup. In order to balance these player losses a big recruitment effort was made over the winter to bring in school leavers and restart the overseas player program. A big thank you to Sam Kearns, Matt Aspinall and Duane Pettet for your time and efforts on this. As a result of these efforts we managed to secure 5 overseas amateurs who would all contribute to the Sabres over the course of the season in Laurie Atkinson, Curtis Fletcher, Jacob Holland, Joe Lowe and David Rippengaal.

We also had a large number of school leavers join the club with Alex Brown, Ed Cochran, Ollie Mather, Rob McClean becoming core members of the team. We also welcomed back to the club David Armitt who has moved back down from Northland. As a result of all of these changes there was an excited feeling amongst the squad once the beginning of the season rolled around in October.

During the season the club had the unfortunate situation of the premier womens team having to withdraw from their competition. While this was undoubtedly a disappointment for everyone involved, the silver lining for our team was that their coach, Blair Franklin, was now at a loose end and so moved into the role of championship team coach. This was a massive addition to the team especially with the youth and relative inexperience within the team.

After a reasonable start to the two day competition, a couple of rained off weekends slowed our momentum heading into the T20 comp. The T20 competition didn't start well and we found ourselves out of contention early but recognized that collecting as many points as possible was still important and building into the one day competition was still important. The turning point was a Thursday night T20 game that we had done a lot of work to win but started to throw away with the bat before David Armitt came in and targeted the short straight boundaries at Elmwood 4 with 3 sixes (including one through the top of the trees that should have been worth 12). He got us home with nearly 3 overs to spare with a man of the match 5 wicket bag and 46*.

After an up and down one day competition the other crucial moment in our season came in the second to last two day competition with the threat of relegation still real, up against the bottom placed Lancaster Park on a soggy St Albans Park pitch. After a low scoring first innings for both sides the run chase was getting nervous for those of us already dismissed and watching from the sidelines. With just 20 to win and 4 wickets in hand, Tom McClean spooned one up into the air. The ball landed just short of the fielder but in the commotion, and the story here varies somewhat depending on whose version you are listening to (it ranges from it slipping whilst playing the shot to being thrown in frustration at the assumed dismissal), Toms bat had come out of his hands and fallen back onto the stumps and he was out hit wicket. After a couple more wickets it was getting very tense on the sidelines before Sam Kearns turned down a potentially game-tying second run to take the strike off their leg-spinner. After defending a couple he came down the track and deposited him over cow corner for 6 to win the game and secure our championship status for the 23/24 season.

The players to have played more than 5 games for the Sabres this season were:

David Armitt – 163 runs @ 14.8 and 28 wickets @ 11.1. DA was a welcome return to the team when he arrived back from Northland not long after the start of the season. With the control to bowl tough overs at the start and end of white ball innings as well as wicket taking ability with the ball turning

both ways DA was a leader within our attack and someone I could always turn to when in a jam.

Matty Aspinall – 41 runs @ 6.8 and 17 wickets @ 23.1. Coming off the back of a 43 wicket season and being light on seam bowlers Matty was a key cog for us with the new ball. He was also able to make a well-deserved premier debut during the season and stood in as captain for one game when Sam and I were both away.

Laurie Atkinson – 259 runs @ 15.2. Laurie joined us from the UK this season and immediately made an impact as a top order bat. Laurie has always been a positive presence in the group leading on the field and in the clubrooms after the game. Laurie is looking to stay around Chch next season and we will welcome him back with open arms.

Alex Brown – 158 runs @ 17.6. Brownny joined us from CBHS this year and took up a role at the top of the order in our white ball lineup. As a batsman he hits the ball hard, and looks to make the most of the powerplays in white ball cricket. While he failed to capitalize on a few starts this season, he is a player with a lot of talent who can be a big part of this cricket club going forward.

Ed Cochran – 187 runs @ 15.6. Ed joined the club from Christ's College, having played a few games previously when school cricket wasn't playing. Ed is an opening bat with a good technique who plays the ball late and appears to have plenty of time at the crease. Since joining us at the end of the school season he has provided stability to the top of our batting lineup.

Curtis Fletcher – 30 runs @ 10 and 16 wicket @ 16.9. Curtis was another of our overseas amateurs. A left arm orthodox bowler, he joined the legion of spinners we had this season. Curtis was also a gun fielder and was unlucky not to play more games for us.

Jacob Holland – 153 runs @ 9 and 22 wickets @ 25.1. Jacob is big left arm seamer who looks to hit the ball hard. He opened the bowling with Matty for the majority of the season. Jake took wickets at key times for us this season and watch out to whichever opposition made him angry. The ball came flying through much quicker whenever that happened.

Sam Kearns – 289 runs @ 16.1 and 26 wickets @ 11.0. Sammy has been a key member of this team for a number of reasons now and this season continued that trend. He was named team and club player of the season for contributions with bat, ball and leading the side in my absence. He managed to achieve all of this whilst also undertaking the role of Men's Club captain which is a huge effort from him.

Ollie Mather – 8 runs @ 2 and 4 wickets @ 22. Ollie has joined us from STAC with father Richard being a long time member of the presidents mens side. Ollie only made a few appearances before suffering a back injury that ruled him out of the end of the season. In the few appearances he was able to make he showed his ability with the ball as a skiddy quick bowler that hits the bat hard.

Rob McClean – 41 runs @ 13.7 and 6 wickets @ 16.5. Rob joined us from Christ's College and joined his older brother Tom in the team. He is a tall right arm bowler who is able to extract extra bounce and is just as dangerous with an older ball as the new ball, so was a good addition to our bowling attack, offering a different point of attack. Unfortunately Rob also suffered an injury that ended his season prematurely.

Tom McClean – 205 runs @ 9.8 and 18 wickets @ 21. Tom was a consistent presence for us this season, batting middle order, being a reliable option as third spinner and offering leadership on the field. He really improved at the bowling crease this season and was always willing to bowl tough overs at set batsmen, with smart field sets. While he didn't score as many runs as he would have liked he still made contributions across the season and is a key member of this side.
