OBITUARIES

LES WATSON

Leslie Thomas Watson

August 17, 1956 – May 29, 2024

Older club members were saddened to hear of the passing of friend and playing mate Les Watson after a six-year battle, in care, against Alzheimers at the young age of 67.

Les joined the club in 1974 from Papanui High School along with a number of other school leavers from their first XI, many of whom quickly moved into Premiers and all of whom made considerable contributions on the playing field, over many seasons.

Les didn't take long to establish himself as one of club cricket's leading opening pace bowlers and a stellar era ensued, playing 111 games in the period 1975 to 1987. Bowling at a brisk pace and having the ability to swing the ball both ways, Les ended up taking 356 Premier wickets at a great average of 17.92. Today this puts Les at 10th on the all-time career wicket takers in Premier cricket for St Albans. The 1981/82 season saw Les awarded the trophy for most wickets in the club in the season with 50.

Les twice took eight-wicket bags in Premier cricket for the club. Firstly in the 1978/79 summer with 8/31 and secondly 8/57 in the 1980/81 summer. He is one of only two players to achieve this feat for our Premier men's side, after Ted Mulcock in the 1930s.

Playing during a barren era of success for our Premier team, Les shrugged off a leg injury that had plagued him – which largely consigned him to second grade cricket in his penultimate season at the top level – to play a small part in helping break the Saints hoodoo. Featuring in one two-dayer (and three one-dayers), Les signed off from Premier cricket by contributing towards the first leg of the famous Neil Francis-led golden four-peat of 1986-90.

When Les retired from Premiers he joined the "God Squad" which played in the top afternoon grade and continued on for over 200 games for this side, which played Fourth Grade, Cavaliers and finally graduated to President grade. Over 14 seasons in the lower grades he took over 500

wickets at 14 apiece, being a part of five grade-winning line-ups in that time.

His best ever figures were for our President's grade side (now Masters), but ironically came about while he was still in the prime of his Premier career, aged 21 in 1978. As was common in those days, when a senior player couldn't commit to both days of a two-dayer, they would play a one-dayer down the grades instead. Les, who was set to fly to the UK for an overseas player stint at Cockfosters Club the following week, found himself opening the bowling on a misbehaving Hospital Corner 2 pitch instead. Bowling at half pace off a short run-up, Les was still far too good for a 10-man Sydenham side, taking less than four overs to bowl them out for 12. Taking every available wicket, his figures of 9-5 included a hat-trick and are believed to be the best ever by any male club member.

When he hung up the boots in 2001, he had accumulated an incredible 972 wickets in 352 games in St Albans colours at an average of 15.55, including no fewer than five seven-wicket bags. He was very much a lower-order player with bat in hand, with a high score of 48 being more than twice as much as his next best effort in 85 Premier innings. However, he did average close to 20 with four 50s in the afternoon grades.

Les was a quiet unassuming person with a wry sense of humour. He was always reliable and a full time team man. He enjoyed a cold beverage and the occasional late night in the pavilion. Les was also a member of the club's football team that played in the 1980s and 1990s, being an integral part of the defensive unit and an on-field general.

Les will be sadly missed by all that knew him.

He is survived by his wife Cathy, children Beth, Amy, Thomas and four grandchildren.

JONATHAN HORNE

Jonathan Ramsay Horne

May 3, 1961 – October 25, 2023

An integral club member for two decades, Jonathan ("Jono" to his family, "Jack" to his clubmates), son of life member and long-time club secretary Eleanor, passed away suddenly at Christchurch Hospital after suffering a heart attack. He was 62.

A wicket-keeper/batter, Jonathan joined the club in 1979 and was a core member of the 9th grade side, contributing the most runs in 3 of his 1st 4 seasons. Taking over the reins in his 4th season, he was skipper of various sides over the following 8 years, first graduating to 6th grade for a season before leading the rebuild of the club's decimated 3rd XI in 1984.

He came on to the club's committee in 1983 and was joined by Eleanor three years later, but increased work commitments in 1989/90 forced him to step down after a six-year stint. Having fostered a number of talented young 3rd XI cricketers to fulfil their potential to go on to greater things, he himself finally earned a promotion as a regular player to the 2nd XI in 1990/91. His silky glove work shone through, particularly when keeping up to spin, claiming the Bob Webb Memorial Cup for most dismissals in a single grade (26); and a total of 39 victims across the entire season.

He took a season off, but nonetheless still assumed a senior role in the club: as a highly revered manager of the Premier men's side, which won the 1991/92 two-day title. Captain Ben Harris noted his wholehearted contributions, which included organising covers, making the odd impactful appearance as a substitute fielder and even on occasion being tasked with buying the skipper's Lotto tickets for him!

Jonathan returned to the playing field in 1992/93, now firmly as a social cricketer with Alan Jamieson's "God Squad", in what was the indomitable side's last season in 4th grade. With most of that side going to Cavaliers the year after, he remained in 4th grade to join the legendary BBBBs unit, scoring a 50 on debut. That season he earned his first title as a player and the team then went back-to-back. Gary "Skip" McCarthy described Jack's batting thus:

"if it is up, it is padded away with no grace or the umpire is signalling a boundary and the bowler is left scratching his head wondering 'How the hell did he hit it there when the runs are needed?'"

With McCarthy working in Wellington, Jonathan had the opportunity of captaining the BBBBs in 1996/97 and under his stewardship the team won the last-ever Christchurch afternoon grade two-day cricket title. He retired the following year, going out on a high with the BBBBs in the new 5th grade one-day competition with "Skip" paying tribute to Jonathan's dashing batting, humour, wit and commitment to the team.

Overall, he played 228 games for St Albans (90 in 3rd grade, 60 for the BBBBs, 60 in 9th grade and 18 others), scoring 6355 runs at an average of 23.89, with 27 fifties and 3 centuries. His three tons were all scored in a hot 18-month period spanning 1987-89, the best of which was 116 not out for 3rd grade against Sydenham in 1988/89 (a knock which topped the club's batting charts that season). He also took 207 catches and effected 20 stumpings. He only bowled 5 balls in his Saints career: fittingly, he took a wicket off the final of these.

Jonathan was still a presence after his playing days, often helping out Eleanor prepare for her lunchtime catering stints outside our pavilion for the hungry hordes from the 4 games being played on Hagley Oval plus many more on the surrounding grounds. He also became a highly qualified Canterbury football (soccer) referee. Sadly, he was diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis in 2015, but still kept up his BBBBs connection, contributing a couple of marvellous poems (attached below) for the team's 30th anniversary held in 2018 and the 35th in April.

Jonathan is survived by mother Eleanor, wife Nicola and son Ethan.

ADMINISTRATION REPORTS

CHAIRMAN/PRESIDENT

A cliché says that the only constant is change, and for the St Albans Cricket Club the 2023/24 season certainly lived up to this. From the retirement of the core group of Premier men's players who had helped bring the club so much success during their careers, to the need to rearrange coaching roles during the summer and needing to respond to our elected president/chairman Greg Olliver having to take indefinite medical leave at the end of March, the season certainly presented its share of changes. However, as always, the solid foundations of the club allowed it to not only respond to but cope with these changes. My thanks to the committee, all club members, and other club supporters who helped make this happen.

This report also outlines some other changes to come in 2024/25.

Team Performances

As always, playing numbers were sometimes a challenge, and my thanks to all those players, captains, and committee members who did what they needed to when required. Despite this, four of our afternoon grade teams rose to the top of their competitions to secure titles.

A huge congratulations to the Division 4 Superkings, Division 6 Buccaneers, Cavaliers T20 Fozzies and the Social T20 Women. Notably, the Buccaneers and Fozzies each won their respective minor championship finals to pick up a second piece of silverware. The T20 women joined an exclusive group of Saints teams to win three titles in a row.

We also note the club's Chairman's Cup XI Lions victory in this knockout competition, after winning a low-scoring affair against Burnside and then edging Richmond in a tense final at Richmond Park. Our thanks to Duane Pettet for continuing to manage and skipper this team, as it is a good competition for the club to be involved in.

Although the top three men's teams didn't produce the results they would have liked, the young talent on

display was impressive, and showed that future success is achievable with hard work, dedication, and quality coaching.

Overseas Players

The club welcomed back Joe Lowe from England, and his colleague Nabil Moughal for his first visit, into the Premier men's playing ranks. Both made significant contributions to the team and the club, Joe being captain for most of the season and Nabil having a stellar summer with the bat, in addition to a golden arm with the ball, to the extent that Nabil's 625 runs and 18 wickets secured him the team's player of the year award. Their fellow countryman, Laurie Atkinson, continued playing for the club after 'wintering over' in Christchurch, and was a valued member of the Championship Sabres.

Representative Selections

Congratulations to Lachie Harper and Ben Russell for their selection for various Canterbury A matches, and Alex Brown for selection in the Canterbury Under-19s team. We are sure that more representative selections await these three players, and of course others from the St Albans playing ranks.

Coaching

The club owes a massive thanks to its coaches – Blair Franklin, Ben Rapson, Mark Lane, Rob Young, and John Stewart – who all played a critical role in the development of our players across many practice sessions and game days across many months. The playing component of the club wouldn't be what it is – and looks set to be again in the coming season – without your efforts, so we gratefully acknowledge your contributions.

A potentially unique development in New Zealand club coaching was the growing role of Harrison McConchie, a University of Canterbury Bachelor of Sport Coaching student, as performance analysis coach. Harrison's use of the NV Play live streaming system has evolved to make

full use of its video analysis capabilities, and this has become a highly valued tool to support other coaches and the wider Premier men's squad. Harrison even delivered some well-attended mental skills sessions. The magnitude of Harrison's contribution was rewarded at the end of the season when the committee unanimously voted to award him the coveted Peers Cup, for the member contributing most to the club on and off the field. We hope to keep Harrison involved with the club next season.

Recruitment

Thanks to Blair Franklin's dedication, preparations for the new season are well underway, as he has already been providing coaching to players in his own time this winter and recruiting new players to the morning grade men's section of the club. We are very pleased to already be able to confirm that Blair will be our director of coaching in 2024/25 and will lead the pre-season sessions at the Sir Richard Hadlee Sports Centre beginning in early August.

Social Scene

The social side of the club was dominated by a much-improved turnout to the annual Christmas Party, a very well attended Australian Test match, and a vibrant end of season/prize-giving night in late March. My thanks to those committee members and others who put in a huge effort to make these events a success. However, with virtually no midweek sales due to trainings no longer being at Hagley, patronage on a 'normal' Saturday night being average at best, and the club's insecure future at Hagley Oval, the committee has recently taken the difficult decision to close the pavilion bar.

This decision is one part of the start of the club's transition away from Hagley Oval, along with the committee's current work with the Christchurch Metropolitan Cricket Association and the Christchurch City Council to relocate our playing and training base to St Albans Park, and a plan to use The Bealey as our clubrooms during the week after practice sessions and on Saturdays. In the short term, our pavilion will still be used for special club events such as Christmas parties and prize-giving nights, on a BYO basis.

The committee understands that this is a major change for the club, but our future is away from Hagley Oval, so we look forward to all club members supporting this transition as much as possible.

I would also like to thank the gaming trusts, who granted us invaluable funds to cover a lot of the club's costs, including Pub Charity, New Zealand Community

Trust, Kiwi Gaming Foundation, Air Rescue Trust, and Mainland Foundation. I and the committee look forward to continuing to work with all these organizations in the future.

Summary

Finally, if the only constant is change, then the 2024/25 season promises to live up to the cliché even more than the last 12 months. The plan to begin transitioning the club from its Hagley Oval base has been communicated and continues to evolve, but we must approach this change as necessary to ensure that the club not only continues but thrives in a new home.

Again, we appreciate that this change will be unsettling for some, but a 119-year record at Hagley Oval is something we can all be extremely proud of, and it is now time to focus on building a stable platform so we can look forward to raising the bat a second time. I and the committee look forward to this challenge and the support of all club members and supporters to once again manage this change as we always have.

I look forward to seeing you all at the annual general meeting, pre-season training or on opening day as we begin the St Albans Cricket Club's 120th season.

MEN'S CLUB CAPTAIN

The Men's season began with pre-season, led by new Director of Coaching, Blair Franklin. I would like to thank Blair for his work throughout the season working with the squad. The relationship formed in the previous season between St Albans and St Thomas of Canterbury College continued to strengthen this year with the employment of Ben Rapson as a morning grade assistant coach. Thank you to Ben for his efforts on the field and off it. This period also saw the arrival of overseas players Joe Lowe, returning after a phenomenal 2022/23 season, and fellow Flitwick Cricket Club player, Nabil Moughal. The season also saw the revival of the afternoon grade side, the mighty Buccaneers, led by captain Elliott Anderson-Evans.

The Morning grade season started off, as per normal, with the two-day competition for Premiers and Sabres, and for the first time in a restructured competition, with one-day cricket for the Division 2 Jaguars. A mixed bag of results for both the Premiers, Sabres and Jaguars saw difficult starts to the season for the two formers, however, the Jaguars did enough in the one-day competition to qualify themselves for the top section of the two-day competition in the New Year.

Twenty20 cricket was played in December this season, in a new group format for the Premiers and Sabres. Whilst the Sabres struggled to put together the two wins out of three needed to reach the semi-finals, the Premiers put

together the victories required to qualify, one of which included a Lachie Harper special where he struck sixes off the last two balls against East Christchurch Shirley to win the match. In the semi-final against Lancaster Park they bowled solidly but were unable to put together the batting performance needed to advance to the final.

Results remained steadily positive for the Division 4 Superkings and Division 6 Buccaneers, who both went into the Christmas break in strong positions in the league standings.

In January, we welcomed St Bede's College leaver Connor Stewart to the club. Connor slotted straight into our Premier men's side as a wicket-keeper/batsman at the start of the year and continued to put together solid performances.

January proved a testing time for the morning grade squad, with positive one-day results proving difficult to come by for the Premiers and Sabres. The Jaguars, however, put together solid results that saw them sitting mid-table for the two-day competition, which is, ultimately, where they found themselves at the end of the season.

Huge results from the Buccaneers meant the top of the Division 6 competition began to hot up, including a tie with their eventual final opponents, Weedons. Fourteen wins

and four losses took them to the Major Championship title win and that final, thanks to contributions throughout the season from all players. After a 101-run win against Merivale-Papanui in the semis, the Buccs faced up against Weedons for the Minor Championship final. An all-round team effort with the bat built a score of 231/7 in their 40 overs, which proved too many for Weedons who were bowled out for 121 with Zane Phillips getting amongst the wickets.

Similarly, the Superkings put together 14 wins, which took them to a first Major Championship title after challenging closely in their maiden Saints season the year before. Consistent runs were supplied from around the squad, however, standouts Harpinder Singh and Karanbir Singh produced stellar performances. A special mention must go to Gagan Bhaskar who racked up 40 wickets during the season at an average of just 9.50, including four five-wicket hauls. They missed out on doing the double however, losing their Minor Championship semi-final.

St Albans also had another crack at the Chairman's Cup, a competition that encourages members from multiple teams to combine to play together in a club representative XI. This year was again managed and captained by club legend Duane Pettet. After a dusty three-wicket win chasing just 52 against Burnside West University in the semi-final, Saints visited Richmond for the final. After three wickets from Matt Kyle and an extremely tight spell from Josh Roche, Richmond scored 158/7, a par score in their 40 overs. However, 41 from Owen Rees and contributions from James McKegg and the skipper, Duane, himself, took the game towards Saints' favour. Some late innings bombing from Zane Phillips got the Lions over the line in the 40th over for the teams' first title in this

competition. Congratulations to Duane and the team since I know how much work goes into sorting that side.

The last day of the season saw our prize-giving take place in the Alan Jamieson Lounge up in our Hagley pavilion. Members gathered to celebrate the achievements of others and remember the season that had passed. A lowlight for me was my name being one of a number being read out for the Most Ducks award. Thank you to Duane for organising a fantastic evening.

Lastly, thank you to all the members who made this season possible. There were some ups and downs, however, it is the strong sense of community that brings the club together and encourages us to continue playing the sport we enjoy. A special thank you to all the captains who put in the extra work throughout the season, organising players and games. Finally, thank you to the committee, whose work keeps the club working for the many members who enjoy the fruits of playing club cricket.

It has been a pleasure fulfilling this often challenging role over the past two seasons, but it is time to pass the baton on. As I depart this post, the thing I am especially heartened by is seeing how much progress has been made bringing in so many new young faces to the morning grade section. It is a rejuvenation that will forever be a work-in-progress, but having navigated a rocky path through up-and-down on-field performances as the hatchlings learn their trade, we're well on the way to emerging as a consistent force again. We need look no further than the incredibly consistent afternoon grade sides for inspiration in this department. Long may it continue!

FINANCIAL REPORTS

TREASURER'S REPORT

The accounts presented to members recorded a deficit for the 2023/24 season of \$36,990. This compares to the previous season's deficit of \$27,306. The increase in the deficit is a combination of depleted revenue and increased expenditure incurred during the year.

An increase in bar gross profit of \$8,154 from 2023, due to the availability of the clubrooms post-Women's World Cup restrictions, was unfortunately offset by a declining membership base, sponsorships and donations to the total of \$13,610.

Pleasingly, grants revenue increased by \$14,674 from the previous year with the introduction of an external consultant dedicated to the application of grant funding.

However, some operating expenditure (coaches and practice facilities) which potentially would have been subsidised significantly by grant funding, was not applied for in time and only partial funding was received. These costs were covered operating revenue.

Operating expenditure for the 2024 year is reported at \$105,120 compared to \$95,310 for the previous period, an increase of \$9,810. Most costs aligned to the previous year though while there were cost savings in material costs – gear and balls (\$12,337), cleaning (\$1,832) and presentations & awards (\$2,711) being the main areas of reduction. There were costs that increased with coaching (\$10,620), material costs – clothing (\$11,702), practice wickets and preseason training (\$2,004) and accounting & consulting fees (\$3,040) the significantly increased costs.

It should be noted the increased costs in both coaching and practice facilities were only partially covered by grant funding as noted earlier while all material costs for clothing is generally fully covered by pre-approved grant funding. The committee have taken steps to rectify the shortfall in grant funding by establishing processes where costs are not incurred until approved funding has been confirmed. Grant funding for coaching, balls & gear and

practice facilities have been submitted to the respective funding agency based on detailed quotes from suppliers for the upcoming season.

As with the previous season, the impact of the increase in the cost of living should not be understated. It seems both sponsors and fund providers generally have taken a cautious approach with regards to where and who they support. This same approach should be taken when approaching the topic of members subscribing to another season of cricket. To that point, the committee was very conscious of this issue and subsequently issued relatively minor increases in subscriptions charged in the 2023/24 completed season.

The financial position of the club at year end reports net assets decreasing to \$17,227 compared to \$54,217 at previous year end, a reduction of \$36,990. The reduction in net assets is a reflection of the poor trading performance of the club for the year as noted above.

At year end a significant loan of \$18,000 from Peter Mayell was received in early May 2024 to assist with reducing accounts payable balances. The remaining accounts payable balance at year-end of \$12,206 have agreed payment plans assisting the club's cashflow.

Accounts receivable at year end are reported at \$5,710 with sponsors and outstanding subscriptions the main issues. There has been a reduction of this balance to a current amount of \$3,790 with continuing contact to collect all balances outstanding.

Property, plant and equipment continue to reduce by annual depreciation. There were no assets purchased during the period. The pavilion as usual forms the bulk of the assets that total a closing book value of \$31,898.

Notes to the Financial Statements

For the year ended 31 May 2024

Note 1 - Statement of Accounting Policies

St Albans Cricket Club is a non-profit organisation. The financial statements are general purpose and prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting practice.

Unless otherwise stated the accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of earnings and financial position on a historical cost basis have been followed.

The entity qualifies for differential reporting because the Club meets the framework for differential reporting as the Club is not publicly accountable and is small. The Club has taken advantage of all differential reporting exemptions.

Changes in accounting policies: There have been no changes in accounting policies which have been applied in basis consistent with those used in previous years.

The following specific accounting policies which materially affect the measurement of financial performance and financial position have been applied.

Accounts receivable are stated at their estimated realistic value. Debts which are considered uncollectable are written off. There is no other provision for doubtful debts.

Stock on hand - bar supplies has been valued at lower of cost or net realisable value.

Stock on hand - balls has been valued at lower of cost or net realisable value.

Equipment on hand has been valued by the committee.

Sponsorship for services rendered to the club are accounted for as revenue and expense at values approximating the cost of the services provided.

Property, Plant and Equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation has been calculated using the rates shown in the Property, Plant and Equipment Schedule (Note 2). Materials, nets and junior material have not been depreciated as the committee charges all repairs, maintenance and replacements to expenses.

A mortgage security over the pavilion is held by Westpac Banking Corporation. At 31 May 2024 there were no advances drawn against this security (2023 Nil).

Related Party transactions: The Committee are also members of the Club and pay subscriptions on the same basis as other members. Services provided have been supplied on normal commercial terms.
